'DECISIONS 2001' video

This video was produced by Squash Australia Rules and Refereeing Committee to assist squash players with explanations and interpretations of the rules, so that they may apply them accurately and consistently when refereeing and marking.

Correct terminology is used and examples of the decision-making process are provided.

Maximum benefit would be derived from the use of the video by juniors and players in the lower grades of competition squash, although it is of benefit to all. The use by coaches in initial training of players is ideal, so that the poor habits shown by many experienced players are not perpetuated.

Potential referees wishing to complete their coaching qualifications will find the correct marking terminology and examples of the decision making process in interference situations, extremely useful.





'SQUASH REFEREEING TRAINING' VIDEO

This video was produced by Squash Australia Rules and Referees Committee in 2001.

We recognize that there are limitations to videos with regards to squash filming in any circumstances and more particularly to see the ball with relation to player's movements for making refereeing decisions. In this video there are 48 situations shown at normal speed and from the usual centre view. Viewers have 10 seconds to decide on the answer and write it down. Then you will see the same 48 situations, but this time from 3 angles – firstly again from the central view, then each decision will be shown from left and right cameras. Write your decisions down after the 3rd view.

You can then compare your own answers between the 2 run-throughs. Your paper will not be officially marked or seen by anyone except yourselves. It is not an examination. If you get decisions wrong, you don't lose your accreditation. We just want to help you learn a little more about refereeing.

Squash Australia's 'Decisions 2001' video is instructional - e.g.. "In the following situation you will see Green ask for a let after minimal interference".

This 'Squash Refereeing Training' has been added to our resources as a 'teaching tool'. It especially emphasizes the 2001 rule changes (minimal interference, distraction and unnecessary turning), and interference (particularly backswing and drop shot situations).

We anticipate this could be used after a Theory Course, then with the "Decisions 2001 " video, to be seen and worked on by candidates before they start their practical assessment.
